- 1 in every 3 people in New York City—that's 2.7 million—can't make ends meet.
- It is not okay for families to choose between rent and electricity, food and doctor visits, daycare and books.
- Achieving self-sufficiency—the ability to make ends meet without public assistance—is hard in neighborhoods of concentrated poverty.
- These struggles go beyond adults. Children from these low-income families often don't have access to equal education—hearing 30 million fewer words by age three than their more affluent peers.
