Dear Friends,

This past year, United Way of the Dutchess-Orange Region continued to respond to the pandemic crisis which has had profound economic, mental and health effects on our community. As a result of your generosity and support, we were able to help 232,738 people. Through our many partnerships and community collaborations, each dollar leveraged equates to four dollars in impact. From the bottom of our hearts, thank you.

The pandemic disrupted every facet of our lives and especially impacted our community's most vulnerable households: ALICE households, survivors, veterans, single parents and children. Through our crisis intervention programming, we were able to provide immediate relief and support to students, veterans and low-income families experiencing devastating financial crises. This support enabled them to stay safely and securely housed while they sought employment, training and other opportunities to become financially stable. Unfortunately, hunger continues to ravage our community and, like many other issues, it too was exacerbated by the pandemic. With your help, we were able to support 200 local food pantries and ensured children had food at home and over the weekend when free school lunch was not available.

Through our essential items program, we distributed \$350,000 worth of new household, hygiene, PPE and children's items to families in crisis. To meet the needs in education, United Way invested in comprehensive after school programs, provided tutoring and mentorship opportunities that offer a pathway to graduation and further learning. Due to the extreme mental health crisis, we supported sucicide prevention and violence prevention programs for youth and families. Families may also received a discount on their prescriptions through our Family Wize partnership. Working together with our 2,000 plus talented, passionate volunteers, we delivered food, worked with seniors and increased equity in our community. Additionally, we provided access to critical shelter and meals through our Emergency Food and Shelter Program.

Finally, through the Hudson Valley 2-1-1 program United Way was able to offer a free, confidential 24/7/365 human service helpline with trained staff, available in over 200 languages. A call to 211 provided families with resources for housing, food, mental health access, senior care, financial assistance and access to vaccination information. It is the first call that resulted in meaningful help for families in crisis or with human service inquiries. Additionally, we supported 140 special projects that provided food. PPE and essential items to community members affected by COVID as a result of our COVID Response Fund launched at the beginning of the pandemic crisis. While the pandemic remains a concern, we continue to offer imperative resources and supports to the families who call Dutchess and Orange County home. We are ever grateful for your continued support.

We look forward to seeing you at our Community Breakfast on September 14th as we celebrate the annual kickoff of our workplace campaign. Thank you for your important work in impacting and changing lives for the better.



Meet Andrea



Andrea is a single mother. During the pandemic, she fell ill and needed emergency surgery. Unfortunately, she quickly fell behind on rent due to the unanticipated medical bills. Although she applied for disability, she was aware that the process could take some time and it could be a while before she would receive any payments. Frantic and fearing eviction, she called the 211 helpline and was connected to a United Way funded program that was able to pay her \$2,200 back rent and keep her and her children safely housed. She has since returned to work and has been able to pay her rent going forward. Overall, she expressed her gratitude in being able to focus on her healing and wellness after receiving the assistance she needed.

leet George

George is a family man who works at a local grocery store. Tragically, he lost everything in a house fire. His children and parents also lived with him. They experienced smoke inhalation, burns and the trauma of losing all of their belongings. His children were scared and anxious to get back to school. He reached out to his friends and colleagues for help. Fortunately, they directed him to United Way. United Way set up an appointment with George and was able to provide an entire dining set including table and chairs as well as housewares, clothing, hygiene items and school supplies for the children to go back to school. Once the family was settled into his new home, he gave us a call and said, "This is such a huge weight off of my shoulders. It was so important for my family to be around the table together for our Thanksgiving meal. I don't know what I would have done without United Way."

Dutchess Outreach, Inc.

Fresh Market, our farmers' market, distributes affordable, local, sustainable fruits and vegetables within the City of Poughkeepsie from May through November and accepts all forms of payment including SNAP, WIC FMNP, WIC VF, Cash, and Credit.

Food For Kids

Food For Kids provide enough food to cover two breakfasts, two lunches, drinks and snacks for the weekend to 195 students in Washingtonville weekly.

Poughkeepsie Farm Project (PFP)

City FRESH removes barriers to healthy food choices and encourages healthy eating habits and lifestyle choices among youth and families by providing access to healthy foods, especially fresh vegetables, and positive, engaging learning experiences at Poughkeepsie Farm Project, Poughkeepsie City School District, and in the community.

Regional Food Bank of Northeastern NY

Food for Dutchess & Orange County Feeding Program will provide low-income Dutchess and Orange County residents with nutritious food when they seek food assistance from area food pantries and soup kitchens.

Hudson River Housing

Follow Through Program (FT) aims to increase the long-term financial and housing stability of low-income households during and after their transition to permanent housing in the community.

Newburgh Armory Unity Center Inc.

Healthy Eating and Lifestyles Project (HELP) program will facilitate health, nutrition, and community gardening-focused programming designed to impact Newburgh children and families.

EDUCATION:

Increase opportunities for positive youth development and literacy services.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Orange County

One to One Mentoring Program-Mentors (Bigs) are paired with youth (Littles) ages 6-18 to serve as role models in a structured, caring & trusting mentoring relationship that brings young people together with experienced adults through Community & School-based Programs.

Boys and Girls Club of Newburgh and Poughkeepsie

The Afterschool Project's Early Elementary Education Program is intended to improve academic outcomes for youth through literacy instruction and consists of three structured hours of activities including homework help and tutoring, academic enrichment and electives including classes in the arts, science and technology and sports.

Cornell Cooperative Extension Dutchess County

Green Teen: Building a Workforce through Community Gardening prepares youth for college and work through employment combined with mentoring and education; they learn employer requirements and expectations through mentorship by staff while building a resume and developing vocational and employability skills.

CultureConnect

CommunityConnect is an after-school & summer enrichment program for students who are English as a New Language learners.

Family Services

Youth Services Afterschool Programs provides youth with a sense of belonging in a place where they can develop their academic, athletic, creative, workforce and social skills in fun, supportive, and challenging ways.

Fearless! Hudson Valley

The Youth Education Program operates within schools and youth organizations in Orange County to offer knowledge and tools for youth and adults working with young people in navigating healthy and unhealthy relationships, gender violence and bullying prevention and encourages positive youth development by empowering youth to become leaders and raises awareness of dating violence in their community.



Grace Smith House, Inc.

Positive Youth Development goes into middle school and high school classrooms, administrative, PTA, teacher meetings, and community events to educate these various groups about the signs, dangers, trajectory and coping skills for the problems of bullying, cyber bullying, and teen dating violence.

Hudson River Housing

River Haven provides emergency shelter for runaway and homeless youth as they work toward family re-unification or securing another safe residence.

Land to Learn

SproutEd program teaches Beacon and Newburgh elementary students through school gardens through weekly lessons outdoors, in classrooms, and online, students practice math, science, and writing skills, while also learning about nutrition, tasting veggies, planting and harvesting.

Literacy Connections of the Hudson Valley

Book Buddies recruits volunteers to read one-on-one with children in K-4th grade who are identified by their teachers as reading below grade level.

NAMI Mid Hudson

Ending the Silence (ETS) is a 50-min. presentation to high school students given by a certified NAMI lead presenter and a young adult with a mental health condition who shares their journey of recovery.

North East Community Center

Teen Programming-These programs set the framework for students to become advocates for themselves, be in positive relationships with their families and friends, curb unhealthy or negative behaviors, and reduce violence, delinquency and recidivism.

REAL Skills Network

S.T.A.R.T. Program is a free afterschool program for elementary students K-5th grade in the Poughkeepsie City School District; the program concentrates on techniques that support academic progression and retention.

Vassar College Urban Education Initiative

Vassar English Language Learners Outreach Program (VELLOP) strives to improve academic achievement of ENL (English as a New Language) students in the Poughkeepsie City School District.

FINANCIAL STABILITY:

Improve access to resources to alleviate short-term financial crisis in order to increase local families' economic position.

Catholic Charities Community Services of Dutchess County

Financial Stability Strategy program helps neighbors in crisis seeking to meet basic needs.

Catholic Charities Community Services of Orange, Sullivan, Ulster

Case Management & Crisis Intervention provides services to individuals or families in Orange County who are in crisis as a result of financial emergency.

Cornerstone Family Healthcare

Healthy Connections ensures that homeless patients and families in transition in Orange County have access to medications, non-emergency medical transportation, and information on services to attain financial stability.

Dutchess County Community Action Agency, Inc.

Crisis Intervention & Case Management provides emergency financial assistance for families faced with an economic crisis and case management support to help them navigate out of crisis and into stability

Dutchess Outreach, Inc.

Emergency Assistance Program provides immediate financial relief to clients who are facing utility termination or who cannot afford their prescribed medications.

Exodus Transitional Community

Newburgh Community Reentry Program helps individuals coming home from prison/jail, by providing employment readiness workshops that teach soft and hard skills to obtain and retain a job.

Fearless! Hudson Valley

The Financial Assistance Program (FAP) supports access to emergency financial assistance for the crisis intervention needs of victims of domestic violence engaged in services with Fearless! The program is intended to increase victims' access to safety and sustainability by minimizing the harmful impacts of ongoing domestic violence victimization and abuse, including financial/economic injury.

Grace Smith House, Inc.

Meets Basic Needs is a program designed to help victims of domestic violence stabilize their lives by providing direct financial assistance to alleviate an immediate financial crisis and provide supports and services needed to empower victims of domestic violence and their children to move towards building a foundation of financial stability and independence

Hudson River Housing

Housing Navigator provides emergency housing assistance to low-income households while devloping housing stability plans tailored to their needs.

Jewish Family Services

Financial Empowerment Program provides emergency funds to members of the community.

Legal Services of the Hudson Valley

Housing & Income Stabilization Services for Dutchess & Orange provides free civil legal services to low-income individuals and families who are at risk of becoming homeless through eviction or loss of home to foreclosure.

Pawling Resource Center

Food Insecurity Grant. The Pantry offers a broad range of healthy and nutritious foods to community residents; clients are able to receive fresh produce, dairy, meat, canned food, personal care items & paper products.

How Poughkeepsie's Hasbrouck House rose to notoriety behind famous owner

Built in 1885 on the east side of Market Street in the heart of the City of Poughkeepsie as the residence of local attorney and county judge Frank Hasbrouck, the two-and-a-half story, red brick structure remains one of the municipality's most distinguished buildings. It sits just south of the Amrita Club building on Church Street, which was founded in 1873 as a gathering place for local businessman and professionals. Hasbrouck was a charter member and the first secretary of the prestigious organization.



Hasbrouck House, 75 Market St., Poughkeepsie

Born in Poughkeepsie in 1852, Hasbrouck was a descendent of three of the 12 patentees of New Paltz: siblings Abraham and Jean Hasbrouck, and Hugo Freer. He was also a descendent of Baltus Van Kleeck, one of the original settlers in Poughkeepsie.

The house was designed in a Romanesque Revival style by British architect Frederick Clarke Withers, who gained notoriety in Poughkeepsie for previously designing the administration building of the Hudson River State Hospital, St. Paul's P.E. Church, and Vassar hospital. "The building was the last domestic house that Withers worked on," Jeffway said. "His contract with Hasbrouck and Poughkeepsie-based mason and bricklayer Charles Round stated that he, as architect, had final approval." "Hasbrouck took a keen interest in the house's construction details," said Bill Jeffway, executive director of the Dutchess County Historical Society. "It had the most advanced central heating and plumbing at the time.

The house included several distinctive features, including a recessed front porch with two round-headed arches divided by a spiral column with a molded floral design and a Corinthian capital. The upper floors feature an oriel window, a pentagonal dormer and brownstone windowsills. The house's design and decorative touches, such as a massive first floor fireplace, brick chimney, glazed tiles and oak woodwork throughout, along with some of the finest furnishings available at the time enhanced its interior space.

After graduating from Dutchess County Academy and subsequently Harvard College, Hasbrouck studied law in the office of Poughkeepsie attorney Orlando D. M. Baker. He was admitted to the bar in 1875 and worked for several years in Baker's office before opening his own practice. In 1875, Hasbrouck was elected to the city's board of health and the following year he was elected Justice of the Peace for Poughkeepsie. He was appointed city treasurer in 1887 and in 1895 U.S. President Grover Cleveland appointed him Poughkeepsie's postmaster. Hasbrouck was elected Dutchess County judge in 1907 and served in the position for six years. His Market Street residence was clearly a reflection of Hasbrouck's stature and wealth in the municipality and he entertained a number of local luminaries while residing there. As trustee, vice president, and eventually president of the Holland Society and a manager of the Sons of the American Revolution, Hasbrouck's involvement and positions in numerous civic organizations saw the house's use for both social gatherings and meeting purposes. In addition to the many civic groups he was active in, Hasbrouck was also a founding member and president of the Apokeepsing Boat Club, regularly hosting meetings at his home.

Hasbrouck died in the house as the result of a stroke on Dec. 18, 1926 and was interred in the Poughkeepsie Rural Cemetery. His death generated glowing tributes from numerous businessmen and associates in the legal community, who attended his funeral, which was held at the residence.



During the latter part of the 20th century, the house was transformed into office space for the United Way of the Dutchess-Orange Region.

"This unusual Romanesque building in the heart of downtown is part of the architecture along the southern portion of Market Street, which includes Harlow Row and the Adriance Memorial Library," said City of Poughkeepsie Historian Tom Lawrence. "The Hasbrouck House is homage to the wealth found in Poughkeepsie in the latter half of the 19th century."

The house was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1982. It is located at 75 Market St., Poughkeepsie.
